Update On Texas Border Security & Immigration

According to data from the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS), tens of thousands of undocumented youth have poured across the Texas border in the last eight months.

On July 18, Governor Rick Perry gave a speech from the State Capitol in which he authorized the deployment of National Guard troops to the Rio Grande Valley. The troops will be integrated with additional DPS agents sent earlier this year to continue Operation Strong Safety, which focuses on reducing criminal activity in the region and securing the border. By adding National Guard troops, Texas will be able to significantly increase efforts to reduce criminal activity.

DPS agents will have been authorized to remain at the border until January. At that

time, they will assess progress and make necessary changes as deemed by leadership and the Legislature. Texas has already seen results from Operation Strong Safety.

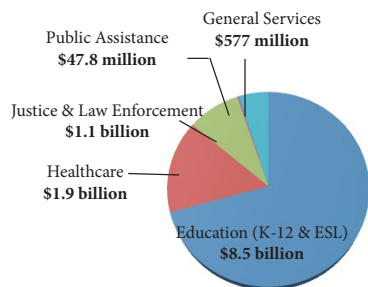
From week one to week three of operations, apprehensions of illegal activity have dropped by 36 percent, from more than 6,600 per week to 4,200 per week in Texas.

As of now, DPS is still in the process of compiling statistics on the current operation, and this information will be released at the appropriate time in the near future. The National Guard troops and DPS will work in tandem in the border regions in the coming

months. DPS is working in concert with the State Legislature to determine what metrics will be used to assess the effectiveness of Operation Strong Safety surge operations.

Our office will continue to provide updates and details as they become available to us for release.

VOTE TEXAS

Texas' Office of the Secretary of State (SOS) released the VoteTexas.gov website in 2012 to help voters determine where, when, and how to vote. VoteTexas is also available as a smartphone app.

Capriglione To Review Lottery

Representative Capriglione was appointed by Texas House Speaker Joe Straus to the Legislative Committee to Review the Texas Lottery and Texas Lottery Commission. The committee was created last year by the passage of House Bill 2197 following a discussion about the Texas Lottery. The committee will study charitable bingo and the distribution of its revenue, as well as the potential impact of eliminating the lottery.

The committee comprises five members each from the House and Senate.

The committee will report their research and suggestions to the Legislature by December 1.

H.B. 2305 Combines Vehicle Registration & Inspection Stickers

In the 83rd legislative session, the Texas Legislature passed House Bill 2305, which eliminates the inspection sticker requirement for vehicles. The vehicle inspection and registration stickers will switch to a single sticker system. The vehicle inspection itself will remain a requirement, but now vehicle owners will have to get their inspection within 90 days before renewing their registration. At the time of registration, drivers have to provide proof of inspection, and will receive a sticker validating the vehicle was registered and inspected.

By switching to this single sticker system, and eliminating the need for a separate inspection sticker, the new system will reduce inspection certificate fraud, and save Texas nearly \$2 million.

Vehicle owners with non-synchronous inspection and registration dates will need to take care of those requirements in a closer time frame. However, many will receive a grace period of a few months during the transition.

H.B. 2305 and the single sticker system will go into effect March 2015.
