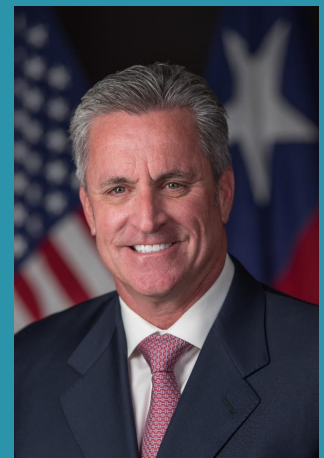

On February 13th, Speaker Dustin Burrows gave out the much awaited committee assignments to the 150 House members. I was entrusted with the Chairmanship of the Corrections Committee, as well as membership on the House Administration, and Licensing and Administrative Procedures Committees. The Corrections Committee oversees the operations of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice and all of its related divisions.

This month we'll give you a light overview of some details regarding corrections management in Texas.

Correctional Institutions Division

As of their last report, there are 135,835 Inmates in their facilities. 124,885 are male and 10,950 are female. Last year they received 52,950 inmates and a majority (61.5%) of those housed have a violent offense on their record. The fastest growing segment (22,953) of the inmate population is over 55, while the average age is now 42.

As of April 30, 2024, there were 2,987 inmates housed in security detention, with approximately 40% based on Security Threat Group membership. In order to decrease the number of inmates in restrictive housing and provide opportunities for rehabilitation and reintegration, the agency began enrolling certain inmates in the Gang Renouncement and Disassociation program (GRAD) or the Cognitive Intervention Transition Program.

Inmate mail is scanned to reduce the potential for narcotics contamination and provided via tablets. Their mailroom staff processed 4,108,866 pieces of mail; 183,389 correspondence denials; 6,313 publication denials; 33,330,997 Jpay e-Messages; and 647,207 pieces of scanned mail.

Air conditioning for inmates is often a concern when it comes to prison and inmate management. As of their last report, Texas has 47,229 beds classified as "cool beds" with another 1,772 currently under construction and 13,190 in the design phase from fund provided in the last biennial budget.

Community Justice Assistance (Adult Probation)

There are 242,640 adults on Direct Supervision plus Pretrial Diversion (Community Supervision Population) Of the inmates serving on probation across the state under the supervision of the Community Assistance Division, 164,928 were felons and 77,712 were Misdemeanors.

- 28,000 Number of parole and mandatory supervision certificates issued

In future issues we'll cover workforce training, rehabilitation & treatment programs, and re-entry planning.

More Bills Filed This Month

[House Bill 2688](#) - This bill makes changes to the Houston Firefighters Relief and Retirement Fund and adjusts the rate of return, retirement age, and years of service requirements, as well as provides for an extension the length of the agreement with the City of Houston.

[House Bill 3008](#) - This bill provides for a minor change in the exemption from fees for peace officers taking college criminal justice courses.

[HJR 134](#) - This bill proposes a constitutional amendment to authorize and regulate sports betting in Texas. This would give the many residents of this state that we have heard from requesting the opportunity to vote on whether they want legalization for an action that is already taking place online but is not controlled by regulation that would benefit the state with revenue.

[Flood Appropriations](#) - Last session, I was successful in securing \$12 million in appropriation funding for "shovel ready" flood mitigation projects within the Cypress Creek Watershed. We have been in contact with the Harris County Flood Control District during the interim and will be requesting additional appropriation requests for the budget again this year. We are focusing our requests on three projects along the Cypress Creek that benefit our constituents and are in the design or engineering phase, in the hopes we can get one funded. The one week filing period for appropriation requests started February 28th.

HB 1182 Court Statistic Compliance

We're very happy to see the progress in reporting for the criminal courts in metropolitan counties, required in the passage of House Bill 1182 that I filed and passed last session. Harris County now has their individual court statistics posted on the District Clerk's Website. Dallas County District Courts have now also caught up and have their stats reported as well.

It is critical that the voting public is able to see the performance or productivity of these elected officials, particularly in the larger counties. The justice system depends on them doing their part to process cases because they have a direct impact on case outcomes and jail overcrowding, which also affects perceptions about public safety.

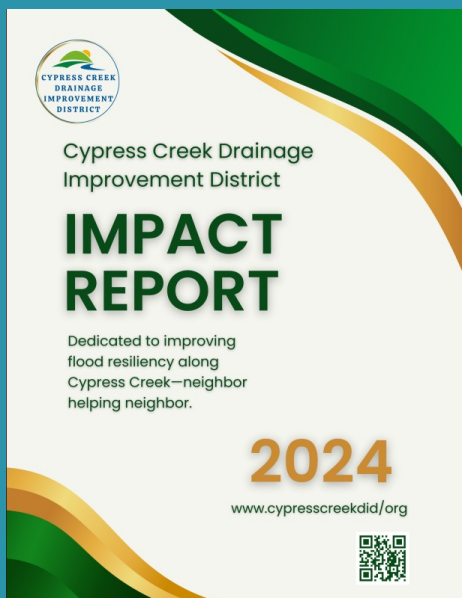

Here is the safety message for March and I will send you the run totals as soon as I get them this morning.

With Spring Season starting soon, we all want to get around to Spring cleaning. We tend to have an up tick in falls from ladders during this time, so we want to give you a few tips on ladder safety:

- Read and follow all labels/markings on the ladder.
- Avoid electrical hazards! – Look for overhead power lines before handling a ladder. Avoid using a metal ladder near power lines or exposed energized electrical equipment.
- Always inspect the ladder prior to using it. If the ladder is damaged, it must be removed from service and tagged until repaired or discarded.
- Always maintain a 3-point (two hands and a foot, or two feet and a hand) contact on the ladder when climbing. Keep your body near the middle of the step and always face the ladder while climbing.
- Ladders must be free of any slippery material on the rungs, steps or feet.
- Do not use the top step/rung of a ladder as a step/rung unless it was designed for that purpose.
- Use a ladder only on a stable and level surface, unless it has been secured (top or bottom) to

The American Heart Month in February promoted heart health education for the public. We had the wonderful opportunity to spend time with neighboring HOA members, who learned how to provide CPR

and help save lives.

Over 73% of out-of-hospital cardiac arrests happen at home. When you learn CPR, you learn a skill that just might save your Valentine's life!

A strong Chain of Survival improves chances of survival and recovery for victims of cardiac arrest, and the first links depend on YOU!

1. Recognition of cardiac arrest and activation of the emergency response system
2. Early cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) with an emphasis on chest compressions
3. Rapid defibrillation
4. Advanced resuscitation by Emergency Medical Services and other healthcare providers
5. Post-cardiac arrest care
6. Recovery (including additional treatment, observation, rehabilitation, and psychological support)

We are also proud to have the crew of Karmin Perry and Jessica Reyes being recognized by the cardiac department at Methodist Willowbrook for their proficiency in taking care of a patient that was having a heart attack. Because of the quick actions and notifications to the hospital, the patient was able to bypass the emergency room upon arrival at the hospital and go directly to the cardiac cath lab for life-saving stent placement.

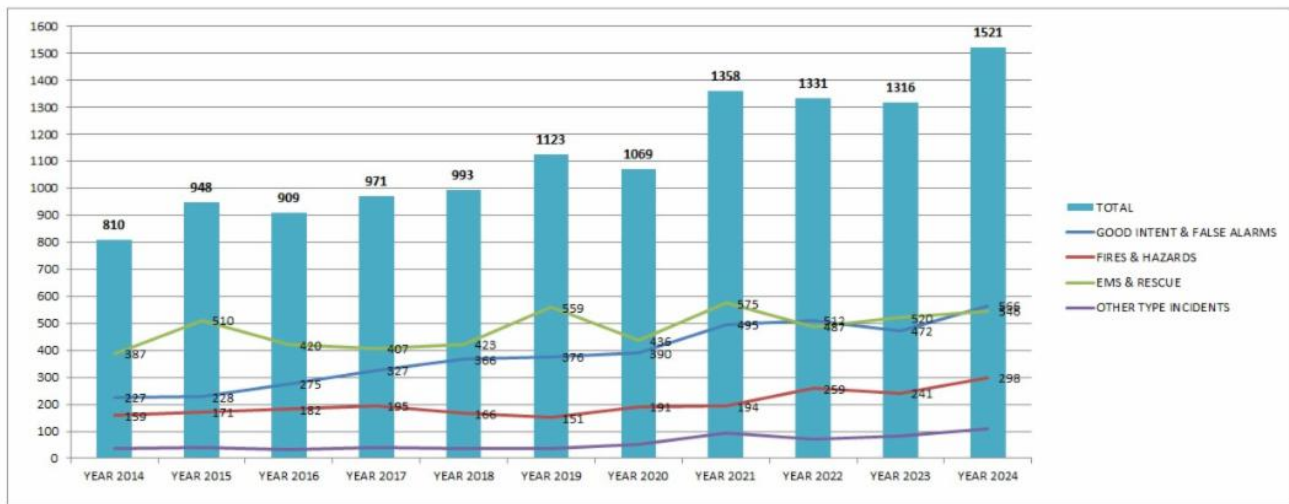

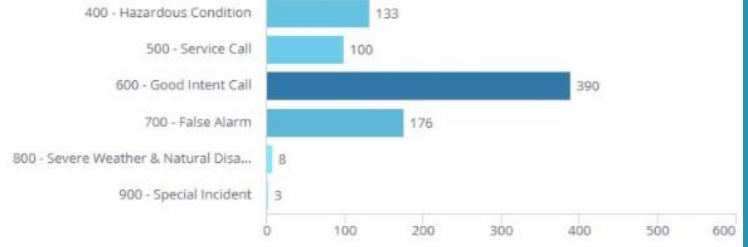
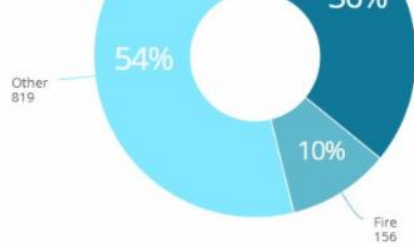

Precinct 4's Infrastructure Division

The Infrastructure Division administers and manages Precinct 4's Capital Improvement Projects Program. The CIP program includes road expansion projects, traffic signals and intersection improvements, and traffic management systems designed to improve mobility and air quality.

The Infrastructure Division also oversees the Child Safety Fund which is used to provide warranted school zone flashing warning signals in compliance with Precinct 4's criteria, the installation of a warranted traffic signal system facilitating the movement of traffic around a school facility to promote student safety. 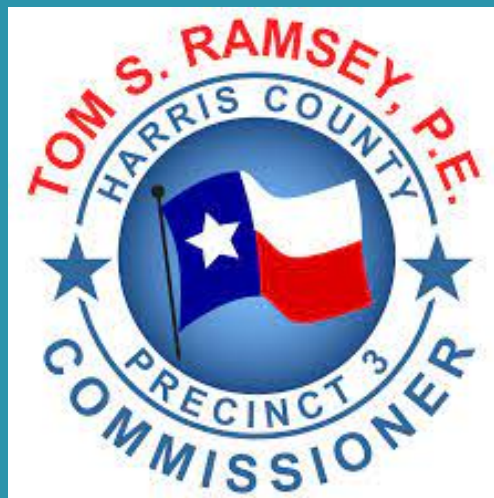
